

### Recommended Sections of Competition Manual

For the following sections National Associations should follow the Manual, but may determine their own procedures.

1.01.B	At present, current PDGA membership applies to Majors and A tiers only in the International countries. At present, the PDGA also does not collect player fees at International events.
1.02.D.4	Club Member Only Events Registration. In the International countries, club affiliation as outlined here refers to affiliation with or membership in the National Association (as is common in Europe).
1.03	Countries may have their own withdrawal & refund system which they are solely responsible for.
1.06	Grouping and Sectioning: All countries should follow the stated procedures. However, they have the following options: Random groupings are allowed in Round 1 at B & C tier events, provided the event has at least 2 Rounds. Some countries also group all players in Round 2 based only on their scores in Round 1. PDGA allows countries with such a tradition to adopt the following procedure: At B & C tier events only, players may be grouped by score regardless of division in Round 2, provided the event has at least 3 rounds. Players must be grouped by division and lowest score (per 1.06 C & D) for the final round of regulation play and in all Rounds after Round 2.
1.08.C.	Cut line at or above Payout line. Different countries and events have different standards here.
1.13	Youth Safety: This section is highly recommended. Each country determines its own protocol, for which they are responsible, regarding parents, guardians, and other persons assigned to this role.
3.07	Tour Vendor Policies. The National Association determines these.
3.08.H.	TD Rights & Responsibilities: The right to demote an event lies with the National Association.
